#### Read Luke 13:33 Jesus speaks about his future Questions for Reflection and Application

- 1. What did Jesus mean when he said that a prophet could not be killed outside of Jerusalem? What does this say about Jerusalem at that time?
- 2. Why is Jesus determined to get to Jersalem even though his life is threatened?

## Thursday

#### Read Luke 13:34 Jesus mourns for Jerusalem Questions for Reflection and Application

**Prayer Focus:** Jesus, we reject you even when you offer us what we crave most: healing, love, and connection. Help us return to the safety of your wings and to change the way of our hearts.

Read Luke 13:35 What will happen to Jerusalem Questions for Reflection and Application

- 1. Do we see Jesus in our world, our lives today?
- 2. What time will come to say "Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord?"

**Prayer Focus:** God, as we retell the story of your last days in this season, help us to hear again how much you love us and how you want to make the way easier for us. We bless your name and thank you again for walking the hard road for our sake.

## Monday

- 1. Why would the Pharisees want to warn Jesus about Herod?

**Prayer Focus:** Jesus, you faced death threats and hatred for your teachings. Even as you went about healing people and teaching, we tried to block out your love. This Lent help us to remember the full truth of the hard road you took to Jerusalem.

# Tuesday

**Read Luke 13:32** Jesus replies to the threat Questions for Reflection and Application

- 1. Why does Jesus call Herod a fox?

**Prayer Focus:** Reflect on what Jesus said to the people who wanted to get rid of him. Give thanks that he chose to do his work right up until the very end. Ask for the courage and strength to do God's work no matter what.
