Prayer Focus We don't always like surprises, God. We want news and events to go according to our expectations and fit in with our plans and point of view. Help us set down our checklists of what we want, and try to see in a new way, through your eyes.

Friday

Read 2 Kings 5:13-14 Naaman is washed clean Questions for Reflection and Application

- 1. Why did the servants think Naaman was skeptical of Elisha's advice?
- 2. Where in your life do you need to change your mind? What might be the result?

Prayer Focus God, let us calm down and listen to the ones we believe to be our servants. Cool our tempers and free us to see how you have made a way for us to be restored and ready to live again for you. Turn us to you and to your Son, and to your Holy Spirit.

Tuesday

Read 2 Kings 5:7-8 Elisha advises Israel's king Questions for Reflection and Application

- 1. Why was the king of Israel suspicious of Aram's king?
- 2. Take a moment to reflect and pray for the leaders of the world. Is it difficult for you to do so? Why?

Prayer Focus We're afraid to entertain others or even help them because they are outsiders, or not like us. We prepare for the worst when we see them coming. As you showed the king of Israel, thank you for those who point the way to move past distrust into peace and healing.
