Thursday

Read Amos 7:14-16 Amos' reply
Questions for Reflection and Application

- 1. Why does Amos need to show his credentials?
- 2. Have you ever tried to tell the truth and been told to keep it to yourself? How did you respond?

Prayer Focus It's not easy to deal with what seems like bad news on every front. God Our Compass, help us listen to the ones you send to us to show us where we've gone off the mark. Let us be open to your loving criticism and your plan for restoring your world.

Friday

Read Amos 7:17 Amos prophesies Israel's fate Questions for Reflection and Application

- 1. Do you think it was necessary to make Israel suffer such a harsh fate?
- 2. How can you help to avoid and heal the consequences of putting ourselves first?

Prayer Focus You have shown us the way through Jesus and through the ones who have remained steadfast in faith and in love. Holy Redeemer, give us eyes to see and the courage to act on what you require of your people today.

Monday

Questions for Reflection and Application

- 1. Why is God using a plumb line to judge Israel? What was God measuring?
- 2. Reflect on how you are built by God to be straight and true—in God's image. How can you honor that creation today?

Prayer Focus We don't want to see hard lines drawn for us. We want to be able to negotiate. But you know the trouble we can get into in following our own wills and drawing our own lines. Show us how to see and follow your guide, as your children.

Tuesday

Read Amos 7:10-11 Amaziah warns against Amos Questions for Reflection and Application

- 1. What do you think Amos' words meant to Amaziah?
- 2. Amaziah blames Amos for disturbing Israel. How do we tend to treat people who point out our faults?

Prayer Focus We don't like hearing bad news about ourselves—we want to silence harsh words, even if they're true. We want to cover our ears and keep going as we are rather than change our ways. Help us to humble ourselves, God, so we can know your will and your peace.
