**Read: Luke 15:8-10** *Heaven celebrates repentance* **Questions for Reflection and Application** 

- 1. How might our worship change if, every day, we celebrated the lost who are found?
- 2. What could we as a church do to seek out the lost in our community?

**Prayer Focus** Thank you for throwing a big party just to celebrate finding a dime under the fridge, God. You cherish us like treasures rather than dimes and you dance with angels when we turn to you once more. Let us be seekers, finders, and partiers with you, God of All.
