Thursday

Read Luke 9:59-60 Jesus challenges followers Questions for Reflection and Application

- 1. Does it seem that Jesus wants to discourage us from following him? Why?
- 2. Have you ever felt led to take a path away from what was familiar? What was your experience?

Prayer Focus Jesus, your life and death were all about giving everything for us. We are afraid of giving up our small portion to be your hands and feet on earth. Loosen our ties to old ways and show us again that we can rely on you.

Friday

Read Luke 9:61-62 Jesus wants our eyes on him Questions for Reflection and Application

- 1. Why does Jesus ask that we not look back? What does he require of us?
- 2. In your life this week, how will you ask Jesus to help you follow in faith each day? Are you ready to change for a future in Christ?

Prayer Focus Blessed Jesus, show us a plan for facing the need to look back and yearn for other times. Turn our eyes and hearts to you. Keep us in the present. Make us ready to follow you right now, Redeemer.
