- 2. What prayers and songs sustain you while undergoing hardship? How are you a witness to others? **Prayer Focus:** Loving God, ground us in our faith as we undergo hardship. Help us nurture the resources of our faith to be ever-present sources of strength.

Read Acts 16:26-28 Do not harm yourself...

Questions for Reflection and Application

- 1. Why were Paul and Silas not tempted to escape when the jail doors were opened?
- 2. How do they demonstrate integrity?

**Prayer Focus** God, when I am tempted to do the easy, but less honorable thing, send your guiding Spirit.

**Friday** *Believe on the Lord Jesus and you will be saved* **Read Acts 16:29-34** 

# **Questions for Reflection and Application**

- 1. What about Paul and Silas so impressed the jailer that he asked for salvation?
- 2. How does the jailer express his gratitude and joy for salvation?

# **Prayer Focus**

Saving God, refresh and renew our enthusiasm for my faith in You. May my actions demonstrate that You are my first and greatest love.

# **An Ironic Escape**

While imprisoned, Paul and Silas were praying and singing. Suddenly an earthquake shook the prison; doors were opened and chains unfastened. The jailer supposed that prisoners escaped, but Paul and Silas had not. The jailer asked what he could do to be saved. He and his entire household were baptized as believers in Jesus.

This story is one of reversals: everyone whom we assume to be free (the jailer, magistrates, owners of slave girl) is really in bondage, and everyone whom we assume to be enslaved (Paul, Silas, slave girl) has been freed. Christ makes us free.

# Monday

- 1. What does the slave girl who told fortunes, yielding great money for her owners, remind you of today?
- 2. How does the slave girl experience the "way of salvation" of which she spoke? What does salvation mean for her?

# **Prayer Focus**

Most High God, we pray for those enslaved in unhealthy circumstances to bring wealth to others. Save them that they might know freedom and your love.

# **Questions for Reflection and Application**

- 1. What angers the girl's owners such that they take Paul and Silas to the magistrate?
- 2. How might Paul and Silas have felt being stripped, beaten, flogged, and imprisoned for proclaiming salvation in Jesus' name?

### **Prayer Focus**

Source of Courage, grant me such faith and conviction to stand up for my beliefs, even when I am not respected. Embolden all who speak up for your inclusive love and justice.
